National Conference 2007 – Saskatoon, SK – June 25-28, 2007

🍁 The theme and backdrop for the “Water Science & Technology: Implications for Water Management” conference was that: “...advances in science and technology have contributed considerably to our ability to manage water resources, with improvements in areas such as analytical and monitoring techniques, numerical modeling and satellite remote sensing. At the same time, science and technology have also made water management more complex through the introduction of chemically complex pollutants, genetically modified organisms, and increasing water demands”. Sessions were facilitated to explore the theme in more detail and focused on:

- Monitoring, measuring and data dissemination
- Water conservation technologies and strategies
- Public policy, scientific study and available technology
- Restoration, reclamation, and rehabilitation of wetlands and watersheds
- Technology transfer
- Water resource management

The conference was a real success with attendance of approximately 350 delegates. There was very good representation from Alberta members including excellent attendance from the Calgary and Edmonton SYPs.

The National Director’s Meeting was held on June 25, 2007. Andrew Szojka and Kent Bullock attended from the Alberta Branch. John Thompson replaced Maureen Bell as a director on the CWRA National Board. The Alberta Branch reported that they had a successful Branch Conference in Red Deer this spring and that the Branch will be making a \$2500.00 contribution to the CWRA National Scholarship Fund in lieu of speaker gifts. Many of the others at the meeting thought this was a good idea and thought they might do this in the future. There was a lot of discussion at the meeting with regard to developing a CWRA position on a National Water Strategy.

At the AGM, Sonja Meek was elected as the new national president of CWRA. Also, Brenda Toth is the new secretary, replacing Esther Kienholz. There were 2 nominations for president elect, Andrew Szojka (from AB) and Aly Shady – and in a run-off Andrew was elected. Congratulations, Andrew! With Andrew’s nomination to president elect, we are now short one director to represent CWRA-AB at national meetings. CWRA Loses Close Friend and Dedicated Volunteer - John Lilley

 The many CWRA members who came in contact with John Lilley will know the privilege of working with John and benefiting from his quiet thoughtfulness. He was an able facilitator of our meetings, and his writing skills were invaluable. John was also involved with the Canadian Society of Environmental Biologists and was their national president for two terms.

John fought cancer off and on during the last 10 years. This was a battle in which John finally succumbed July 10, 2007 at home in Sherwood Park, Alberta.

The following article is quoted from the Canadian Society of Environmental Biologists newsletter.

"Like many biologists, chemistry and beer played important roles in shaping John Lilley's career! At the University of Toronto in the mid-1960s, he planned to major in chemistry. But with the organic variety of the subject looming large (remember Morrison and Boyd?), in third year he switched to zoology. Shortly thereafter, John found himself in a bar with some biologists who were planning a national meeting. This was one of the early joint conferences between the CSEB and CCFFR, with CSEB organizing the wildlife program and CCFFR taking care of the fisheries. It sounded interesting and John's involvement with the CSEB was launched. John and his wife Judianne started their careers in Winnipeg, and with fishery studies of the Mackenzie River in the Northwest Territories. They then moved to Calgary and on to Edmonton where John continued to work as a fisheries biologist with the Environment Council of Alberta and the Alberta Water Resources Commission.


In addition to the many day-to-day responsibilities of being on the executive of any organization, staying on top of current and emerging issues was a large job. John commented recently that one of the big challenges during those years was keeping the CSEB engaged while remaining professional and not getting politically embroiled in the issues. "We had a great deal to offer as environmental biologists and it was – and still is – important to provide our comments in a credible way that maintained and enhanced CSEB's reputation. We had good ideas and advice for protecting the environment, no matter which government was making the decisions."

In 1995, John formed his own company, Lilley Environmental Consulting.

During this time, John provided many volunteer hours to the Canadian Water Resources Association, Alberta Branch, in finalizing workshop articles and publications on behalf of CWRA. He was also the CWRA Executive Director from 2000-2006.


The Alberta Branch of the CWRA will be making a \$1000 donation to the CWRA Scholarship Fund in his memory. John Lilley will be missed by many in the water resources community.
